Severus Alexander Silver Denarius NGC Mint State -

Roman Emperor from 222-235 AD, this mint state denarius features a portrait of Severus Alexander in lifelike detail. Excellent coin for the money and a great overall look on both sides of the coin. 1883-CC Morgan Silver Dollar PCGS/NGC MS-64

Quality – When it comes to Carson City Morgan Silver Dollars, there are a total of 13 years of issue spanning from 1878 to 1893. Morgan dollars dated 1883 or 1884 from Carson City are the most popular. Please know that the coin pictured here may not be the exact coin you receive. However, it is indicative of the quality and eye appeal that you can expect. All coins will be MS-64 quality as graded by either NGC or PCGS - Available for \$495 each.

Roman Republic Silver Victoriatus Mint State – These Stunning and frosty mint state silver "Victoriatus", issued from 211 – 208 B.C., depict a lifelike portrait of Jupiter on the obverse and a procession of victory on the back. For the price and quality, these are superb coins nearly 2000 years old and each has been certified by NGC Ancients in Mint State condition. 1865 \$2 Newfoundland PCGS About Uncirculated 58 -

This two dollar gold coin was struck in Newfoundland in 1865 and had an extremely low mintage of only 10,000 coins! It's the first year issue of the series that issued sporadically from 1865 to 1888 and has been graded by PCGS in one grade shy of mint state. 1808 Mexican 8 Reale NGC Mint State 63 – Absolutely gorgeous silver 8 Real from Mexico struck in 1808 with original, mark-free surfaces on both sides of the coin. Spectacular detail and solidly struck, we feel that high-end silver from this era is undervalued in the current marketplace. Under 240 examples are graded by NGC and PCGS combined, with only three known finer, all in MS-64. Highly recommended. Only one available for \$2,295.



1898 S \$20 Liberty Gold Mint State 63 Quality – This 1898 San Fran Double Eagle in Mint State 63 is considered a "Better Date" in the series. When compared to a common date, like the 1904, the 1898 San Fran is over 15 times more rare, yet it can be acquired for around only 20% more. Excellent value for the money and it has .9675 oz. of pure gold to boot.

<u>Vespasian Gold Aureus NGC Choice Extremely Fine</u> –

Ruler from 69-79 AD, Emperor Vespasian is boldly depicted on this Roman Gold Aureus. Most certified Vespasian's are in lower grades than the present example and this one is very centered and attractive for the assigned grade. He is known for beginning the construction of the Roman Colosseum and had a long and successful career, residing over a peaceful Roman empire. Coin shown is the exact coin you will receive. - Only one available for \$14,850.



Nero Gold Aureus NGC Extremely Fine – Nero was one of the most corrupt and hated of all Roman Emperors and ruled from 54-68 AD. Known for his unmatched cruelty, he began the first Roman-Jewish War that ultimately destroyed the second Temple of Jerusalem. This coin is accurately graded and depicts the emperor facing right with Jupiter seated upon a throne on the reverse. Coin shown is the exact coin you will receive.
